3. Executive and Speaker Reports

a) President – Jillian Burford-Grinnell (report attached)

Update – Friday and Saturday was the meeting with the board of trustees – the budget was approved. I mentioned that we would be inviting board of trustees to the ribbon cutting ceremony. I will let you know the date when it is confirmed. I brought the referendum results and the AGM discussion points to University council. The principal did specify the AMS and SGPS referendum results. The council does not have the authority to remove the rector. There

was a motion that the students have lost faith in the rector and that is where it was left. Our rector was still our rector.

Marvin Ferrer – Did the motion get voted on?

Jillian Burford-Grinnell – There was a motion that we voted on. The wording was that university council acknowledges the two referendums. If you take the student body as a whole students expressed non-confidence in the rector. We were told by the principal that there have been discussions – this is what the executive has decided to do.

Minoo Kianizad– What were the results of the AMS referendum?

Jillian Burford-Grinnell – 73% voted in favour of removal of the rector. The principal did state the numbers in the meeting.

Member at large – When they compiled all the results were in favour in the removal?

Jillian Burford-Grinnell - No, it was stated that students had lost confidence in the rector.

Marvin Ferrer – Do we have an issue with being lumped?

Jillian Burford-Grinnell – I did bring this up.

b) VP Graduate – Irene Karagiorgakis (report attached)

We are hiring two student advisors. Call for application in the next SGPS newsletter. Deadline is June 6th at 4:30 PM. The discussion panel was not well attended. We are going to recreate this on campus in September for people to voice their concerns. Our panellists were quite high up in university and it would be great to make your voices heard. Due to the low attendance they assumed that this was not an issue.

Anne-Marie Grondin– For people who cannot attend this meeting can people email their concerns?

Irene Karagiorgakis – Yes. If that is an issue I will indicate that in the newsletter as an option.

c) VP Professional – Mark Noble (report attached)

Exciting things at the grad club for various positions. Working on some initiatives to make orientation more inclusive. Habit of the law students running their own orientation. It would be good to have a more inclusive event to make law students aware of SGPS and the events and services offered.

d) VP Campaigns and Community Affairs – Anne-Marie Grondin (report attached)
There are two new additions Becky Pero as the new student affairs academic commissioner. Elizabeth Amirault is the new SGPS equity commissioner. We are going to be talking about the VIA rail petition – I don't have the materials but they should be coming this week. We have had misinformation about the ISIC card. VIA has just confirmed that we can use the ISIC card until December 31st. There are a variety of deals offered for the student saver discount card. I am going to put this into a synopsis so that you can give your departments a full list. I want to draw your attention to two things regarding the provincial election. It might be an appropriate time to tell people about registering to vote. If they are not registered they can go to an application – you have to fill it out and note. I am going to bring it back to council in August and September. It would be a good thing to get it over with. We are going to need volunteers for two separate things. We are going to put together a team for vote education campaign team – trying to get our members in provincial elections. If you are interested email me (email on website). We are also recruiting volunteers for before the platforms come out we would like to meet with future MPPs and discuss what we would like to see on their platforms. 5. Question Period/Departmental Issues

Namit Sharma – This is a question from an international student in my department. There was talk about income of student in terms of a scholarship and that it would not fit into an income bracket. Is something happening with this?

Daniel Moore– The RA employment category. Last summer the SGS change the way graduate RAs file their income. Instead of claiming T4 employment status it is T4a. This way you don’t have to pay taxes up front. Over the last year the executive looked into and asked a number of questions across campus and we have about an 8 page Q&A document. We will have lots of materials come September. We will incorporate this into our department rounds. We have done a lot of work.

Jerome James – There were some pipe issues in Nicol Hall and the water fountains were shut down. I am wondering if there has been any movement on this?

Anne-Marie Grondin– As we move to water bottle ban this is important to bring to our attention. I am going to pass it on to Ivana who sits on a number of important committees related to sustainability. This also sounds like an occupational hazard and should be brought up to health and safety department.

Jerome James- I would just like an update on what is happening.

Anne-Marie Grondin – Was it a lead pipe problem?

Jerome James – It may be.

Nathalie Ouellette – Is there any movement on extending hours of certain services?

7. Main Motions

MOTION 05/10/11:5

Whereas the SGPS policies surrounding the SGPS listserv require updating; and

Whereas the SGPS requires a policy for the E-Newsletter.

Moved ___Anne-Marie Grondin___ / ___Joe Steele___ BIRT
P.10.1 be repealed in its entirety.

BIFRT the following policies be added (in part to replace the repealed P.10.1):

P.10.X SGPS Membership Listserv

a. A membership listserv will be maintained by Queen’s University IT as per the agreement approved by council in October 2005. As members can permanently unsubscribe from the list, it is important that the list only be used for information relevant to a majority of the members. Thus the following policy shall be used.

b. The list shall usually be used twice per month (coincidental with the release of the E-Newsletter P.10.Z) and be restricted to the following content:

- Information regarding fees, opt-outs, and opt-ins
- Changes or information regarding the health and dental plan
- Information regarding referenda and elections
- Information regarding positions available at the SGPS
- Information regarding SGPS social gatherings and events
- Messages from the Executive that respond to issues of immediate significance to the membership.
- Information pertinent to the SGPS membership
- A link to the SGPS E-Newsletter
- A list of the content contained in the SGPS E-Newsletter (in the form of newsletter item titles)

c. The President, as the moderator of the SGPS mailing list, shall be responsible for monitoring the numbers of un-subscriptions from the list-serve and for ensuring the Executive is aware of significant changes to the list size.

d. The listserv may be used beyond the twice per month limit (as outlined in P.10.X.b) in situations where the membership must receive information that would otherwise be late if delayed until the next normal usage of the SGPS listserv. Discretion to use the list beyond the normal limit (as outlined in P.10.X.b) shall rest with the Communications Commissioner and the President (as the moderator of the list).

P.10.Y SGPS Council Membership E-Mail List

a. The Executive Director shall keep an email list of Council representatives.

b. The name, e-mail address and department of Council representatives shall be posted on the SGPS website.

c. The SGPS Speaker or Executive Director may send e-mails to the Council membership e-mail list and ask them to forward messages to their membership concerning health and dental opt-outs or opt-ins, other opt-in and opt-out deadlines, elections, referenda or other information that may be useful to SGPS members.

d. The e-mail alias of the Council Membership E-Mail List shall be obfuscated and kept confidential so individuals other than the SGPS Speaker or Executive Director are unable to use the list.

e. E-Mail messages sent to the Council Membership E-Mail List shall be sent addressed to the Executive Director and bcc'd to the Council Membership E-Mail List.

P.10.Z SGPS E-Newsletter

a. The SGPS Communications Commissioner shall publish an E-Newsletter semi-monthly.

b. The E-Newsletter shall usually be released on the 15th of the month and on the last day of the month.

c. Where the dates set in P.10.Z.b fall on a weekend or a holiday, the E-Newsletter may be delayed until the next regular business day.

d. The E-Newsletter shall be posted in portable document format (pdf) on the SGPS website. A link to the E-Newsletter shall be sent via the SGPS Membership Listserv as detailed in P.10.X (SGPS Membership Listserv).

e. The E-Newsletter shall be used for the following content (though is not limited

to the following):

- Content that is deemed appropriate and acceptable for release to the SGPS membership
- Information regarding fees, opt-outs, and opt-ins
- Changes or information regarding the health and dental plan
- Information regarding referenda and elections
- Information regarding positions available at the SGPS
- Information regarding SGPS social gatherings and events
- Information regarding community social gatherings and events
- Messages from the Executive or Staff of the SGPS
- Messages from Queen's University
- Information pertinent to the SGPS membership
- Information submitted by SGPS members for release to the membership

f. The E-Newsletter shall not be used for the following content:

- Information supporting one side of any referendum question
- Information supporting any candidate for an SGPS election
- Information that is in violation or appears to be in violation of any relevant legislation or the University Code of Conduct, specifically information that is discriminating based on race, national or ethnic origin, colour, religion, sex, age, social status, sexual orientation, gender identity or disability.
- Information deemed inappropriate for distribution to the membership by the SGPS Communications Commissioner and the SGPS President. When the Communications Commissioner and the President do not reach a consensus, the SGPS Executive, by way of majority vote, will decide if an item should be included in the E-Newsletter. If the Executive is not able to vote, for any reason, the default action will be not to include the item in the E-Newsletter.

g. The E-Newsletter shall be approved by the SGPS President prior to being posted on the SGPS website and prior to notification via the SGPS Membership Listserv.

Sean Richards – The newsletter has become entrenched so it was time that policy is written in the case that there are questions and for future directions. It is also for members so that they know how to include items for the newsletter. Policy surrounding distribution list for council and how we protect the list from spam and misuse.

Joe Steele – You state in the outline that you will host the newsletter on the website. The vast majority of students don't read the newsletter because they don't click on the link. Everyone else I talk to, people do not read it.

Sean Richards – We are averaging 4000 downloads per month. If we start including rich text then not everyone with a BB and Iphone cannot download the information. There is a hard limit on how many lines we can send out. There are only so many things we can include there. This is largely why we do the PDF on the website.

Yohan D'Souza – Concerns with the listserv for the entire SGPS. Some people have expressed concern about their emails being taken from that site and be subjected to spam.

Sean Richards – The list is moderated. It has to go through a process internally that we then say whether it can go through.

Mark Noble – Perhaps if we put out information as to the steps we go through to ensure that safety and emails remain private. Would that be something that is helpful?

Yohan D'Souza – That would be great.

Mark Noble – I know there are third party businesses that can send out newsletters with pictures/information to capture more audiences. I think it is a great idea about putting that flash into the email. If there are ways that we can improve to make it better could we look into that?

Sean Richards – We do not need external help. Making it universal so that all the difference devices can see it is difficult.

Mark Noble – That is why I mention third party companies as they make it more accessible.

Sean Richards – We can do that in house and I can work on that over the summer.

Joe Steele – I can get a list from people about what they would like. It is mainly the social events.

Sean Richards – Is it more than just text? Colour?

Joe Steele – It would be something to draw people to it.

Sean Richards – I will come back in August with some material.

Member at large – As I am smart phone user I would argue the opposite. It would be nice to include a plain text file.

Daniel Moore – I would like to know about the policy for content for newsletter. My one concern or question did the executive consider a catch-all policy or vision statement to use when or back-up the decisions that communication commissioner and the president make. I feel that there is not an accountability mechanism for the two people that could come under fire about not including/including information. I was wondering if we should include a broad statement that you could point to if someone had a problem but there is a justifiable reason why it isn't included.

Sean Richards – I wrote the policy with the intent with the communications commissioner and president agree that is pretty good litmus test. Then the executive gets to decide from there. Perhaps you can make an amendment or suggestion on how to improve this.

Andrea Phillipson – I am not sure about what inclusivity means. If it is something general that guides how the E-newsletter is governed perhaps we need both this amendment and something in section 'e' discussing the guidelines and vision of the E-newsletter.

Jonathan Foster – I don't think we need the amendment as it is the job of the communications commissioner and the president. If there is an exception it is clear about what goes in and doesn't.

Anne-Marie Grondin – I think the issue is that different people get elected to the SGPS executive and may have different ideas about what the SGPS should be. Should it aim to please most/all/some of its members? Perhaps one thing would be to consider is add language about ensuring that putting something in the letter will not be a divisive issue.

Jonathan Foster – It is going to change from year to year, but really putting in that kind of wording is still up to interpretation. You can't get away from it. Putting in this policy is another opportunity to interpret.

Marvin Ferrer – I agree with Jon. I would rather they be accountable to the decision instead of putting blame on the policy. I would rather them take the blame.

Andrea Phillipson – By inclusivity do you mean trying to uphold a particular value when making decisions?

Daniel Moore – I don't think neutrality is entirely possible but aiming to be inclusive by trying to capture as many voices as possible.

Yohan D'Souza – I agree that this statement is subject to interpretation, but I like this amendment for two reasons. I think it is nice to have a vision statement for the listserv. And I believe that having a vision statement would be beneficial in case something was to come up. This statement would allow the president and executive to include something or not based upon this vision.

Derek Gray – I wonder about inclusivity. Are we being inclusive of minorities or not creating problems with the majority.

Matthew Scribner – The default action is not to include is almost a competing mission statement in regards to this amendment. Was Andrea suggesting that we could have this in another place?

Sean Richards– I don't believe we have the necessary resources to get every particular angle. The trouble is that we will forget something and will get burned for it. If we had 11 people run for executive, and only 10 submit information, do we include it in or not?

Daniel Moore – Right now no one can submit anything running for election.

Sean Richards – There have been things put in there, but mistakes were made.

Daniel Moore – Inclusivity is just the goal.

Anne-Marie Grondin – I believe that we can try to be as neutral as possible. If we were to be the facts man and we give information about KedCo will someone oppose the fact that we give this out? Will it benefit the majority of our members? No. We are not always going to be able to get everyone on board on what we are advertising. We all have vested interests in different things. When I read through this policy is that the message is that these are tools going to be used by the executive. They are not going to be used by the membership. If they need to post something in the E-newsletter that is an option. I am not that language around inclusivity is not going to avoid or solve the problem its still not solved.

Jon Foster – There is no way to solve this. The policy is a good backbone if people still have major issues we can bring it up at a later date.

Anne-Marie Grondin – This motion is not a surprise. VIA rail decided without consulting partners including CSF to amalgamate its packages assuming that all students are under 25 years of age. We have already called in some complaints. It is an effective means of advocacy to work as a group to say that we are not on board with this.
