Funding Request for Graduate Student Radio Documentary Project

Project:

Provide opportunities for ten graduate students to receive resources towards producing an audio documentary about an aspect of their research. CFRC would help train the students on how to write, record and produce a 30-minute audio documentary. CFRC would subsequently air it, facilitate its distribution to other campus and community radio stations in Canada, as well as Queen's iTunes U and other platforms if applicable.

Purpose:

- To create meaningful opportunities for graduate students to disseminate their ideas and experiment with forms of popular education.
- To create and strengthen partnerships between the SGPS membership and CFRC
- To foster positive relations with the Kingston community through knowledge sharing.
- To create greater exposure for the breadth of research that is coming out of Queen's

Resources for successful applicants:

Financial: Given that graduate students often lack funding, we would like this project to provide some funding, around \$300 for the project as an honorarium for their work.

Skills: CFRC will train students on writing for radio, audio recording and editing as required. Recording equipment will be provided as well as editing software and studio space if needed.

Budget:

We would like to request \$2000 from the SGPS for our project. \$500 will be in kind where we produce and air an advertisement for the SGPS, ideally to be used before the end of 2009.

We anticipate that on average, a documentary would require at least 10 hours of in studio production time. We typically charge \$50 per hour for studio rental though will offer it for \$25/hour for this project. $25*10*10 = \$2500$

Portable Equipment: Assume each student will want to borrow portable recording gear (digital recorder, microphone, appropriate cables) for 3 days each. We charge \$10/day.
 $\$10 \times 3 \times 10 = \300

Staff Time: Please note that we anticipate approximately 2 hours of recording and editing training per student as well as administrative time of booking equipment, providing feedback and promoting final product to other stations and other means.

Sample Endorsement Letter for Task Force on Campus Racism

Endorsement Letter for Task Force

Dear ...,

I am writing to you on behalf of the Queen's Society of Graduate and Professional Students to ask for your endorsement and support for the Task Force on Campus Racism. At our August 2008 general assembly, members of the Canadian Federation of Students in Ontario voted to strike a Task Force on Campus Racism to document incidents of racism on our campuses and provide a forum for students who are racialised to speak out about their experiences. We are hoping that you will support the Task Force hearing at Queen's.

In 2006-2007, the Federation conducted a Task Force on the Needs of Muslim Students which identified not only incidents of Islamophobia but also racism and other forms of discrimination on college and university campuses across Ontario. In order to more fully address some of the issues that arose from this report, along with a number of incidents of racism on campuses across Ontario in recent years, we are launching a Task Force focused on experiences of racism in the post-secondary education system.

The Task Force will consist of approximately ten members that travel to hearings across the province and take statements from students, faculty and staff about their experiences on campus and possible solutions to racism. The scope of the Task Force is not limited to individual incidents, and participants will be encouraged to share their experiences and perceptions about systemic racism and its perpetuation through all aspects of the college or university experience. The findings of the Task Force will be compiled and released in 2009, with recommendations at institutional and governmental levels.

Students in Ontario are seeking your endorsement and support in order to publicise the Task Force and communicate to campus communities about the effects of racism in higher education. Please see the attached motion to endorse, and contact me if you have any questions or to participate in the organisation of the Task Force hearing at Queens.

Minutes of Working Group on Tuition Fees – January 20th

Nature of Action

- A Student run-demonstration meant to draw attention to rising tuition at Queen's.
- Peaceful demonstration will congregate outside Richardson Hall in March, where speakers will address the crowd on the issues.

Goals of Tuition Fee Protest

- 1) Oppose this year's increase in graduate and professional school tuition fees (4% and 8%).
- 2) Express concern about the decreasing quality of service at Queen's (tuition fees increasing along with across the board budget cuts to all departments).
- 3) Call on the provincial government to properly fund public post-secondary education in Ontario.
- 4) Call on all members of Queen's community to assume a leadership role in pressing the provincial government and making our voice heard.
